A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to revive and continue certain Powers conferred on the Corporation of the Town of Napier by "The Napier Swamp Nuisance Act, 1875."

WHEREAS by the above-mentioned Act the aforesaid Corporation was empowered, at any time within two years after the passing of the said Act, to enter upon certain lands specified in the Schedule to the said Act, for the purpose of filling in and reclaiming the same :
 5 And whereas the said term of two years has expired, and the work of filling in and reclaiming the said lands has not yet been completed, and it is expedient to grant further time for the completion thereof :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,
 10 as follows :—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Napier Swamp Nuisance Act Continuance Act, 1877."

2. The several powers and authorities conferred on the Corporation of the Borough of Napier by "The Napier Swamp Nuisance Act, 1875," are hereby revived and continued, and shall be deemed to have continued uninterruptedly from the eleventh day of the month of October now last passed, and shall continue in full force and effect for a term of two years, to be computed from the said last-named eleventh day of October.

3. All the provisions of "The Napier Swamp Nuisance Act, 1875," shall henceforth be read as if the words "four years" had been originally inserted in the second line of the second section thereof instead of the words "two years" therein appearing.

4. All matters and things done by the aforesaid Corporation in connection with any work authorized to be done by the said Corporation under the above-mentioned Act are hereby validated, and shall be deemed to have been legally done, notwithstanding that any such matter or thing may have been done after the expiry of the time limited by the aforesaid Act for the doing of any such matter or thing.
