REHABILITATION AMENDMENT BILL

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill extends the duration of section 4 of the Rehabilitation Amendment Act 1947 for two years from 31 December 1953.

Section 4 relates to the power of the Rehabilitation Board to assist servicemen's widows by the disposal to them of property or by the granting of financial assistance. The principal Act restricts these powers to the widows of servicemen who have died while serving or as a result of their service. Section 4 makes those powers applicable to the widow of any serviceman who has died at any time, whether or not his death was attributable to his service, but unless extended in the manner proposed the section will expire on 31 December 1953.

(1) Section four of the Rehabilitation Amendment Extending 10 Act 1947 (as amended by the Rehabilitation Amendment power to Act 1952) is hereby further amended by omitting from assist certain the proviso the words "thirty-first day of December, servicem widows. nineteen hundred and fifty-three ", and substituting the 1947, No. 49 words "thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred 15 and fifty-five ".
