A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Shipping and Seamen's Act Amendment Act, 1894." Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Shipping and Seamen's Acts Amendment Act, 1899." It shall be read with "The Shipping and Seamen's Act, 1877," and the amendments thereof, and shall come into force on the *first* day of *January*, one thousand nine hundred. Short Title.

2. The words, "Provided further that any person, upon producing proof to the Minister of Marine of his having been in command of any vessel of fifteen tons or over trading on the coast of New Zealand for three years or over since January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four, may be granted a certificate of service, and the possessor of such certificate shall be held to be a duly certificated man," in subsection one, section thirty-four, of "The Shipping and Seamen's Act Amendment Act, 1894," are hereby repealed. Repeal.
