SUBORDINATE LEGISLATION (CONFIRMATION AND VALIDATION) BILL (NO. 2)

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Bill, which comes into force on the day on which it receives the Royal assent, confirms and validates certain subordinate legislation made under enactments providing that the legislation lapses after a time unless confirmed or validated by Act of Parliament.

Clause 1 relates to the Bill's Short Title.

Clause 2 provides that the Bill binds the Crown.

Clause 3 confirms regulations under the Primary Products Marketing Act 1953.

Clause 4 validates and confirms an order under the War Pensions Act 1954.

Clause 5 validates and confirms an order under the Social Security Act 1964.

Clause 6 confirms an order under the Road User Charges Act 1977.

Clause 7 confirms regulations under the Fisheries Act 1983.

Clause 8 validates and confirms orders under the Tariff Act 1988.

Clause 9 confirms orders under the Customs and Excise Act 1996.

Clause 10 provides that the validations effected by *clauses 4, 5, and 8* are for the purpose only of preventing the expiry of the subordinate legislation concerned, and not to cure any invalidity.

PART 2

REPEALS, SAVINGS, AND REVOCATIONS

Clause 11 repeals the Subordinate Legislation (Validation) Act 1997 and the Subordinate Legislation (Confirmation and Validation) Act 1997, which are now spent, and saves the effect of certain validations effected by those Acts.

A BILL INTITULED

An Act to confirm and validate certain subordinate legislation

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

5 **1. Short Title**—This Act may be cited as the Subordinate Legislation (Confirmation and Validation) Act (No. 2) 1998.

- (a) Express an intention to give legislative force to the 35 provisions of those enactments; or
- (b) Apply to any reason for invalidating any of those enactments; or

(c) Override any presumption that would other wise apply to any of those enactments.
