A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Summit Road (Canterbury) Protection Act 1963.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand5 in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

 Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Summit Road (Canterbury) Protection Amendment Act 1973, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Summit Road
 (Canterbury) Protection Act 1963 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

1A. Interpretation—Subsection (1) of section 2 of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding to the definition
15 of the term "structure" the words "; and also includes any building or other structure proposed to be erected, repaired, modified, or extended by the Crown in respect of which such a permit would be required if the erection, repair, modification, or extension were to be carried out otherwise

2. Area to which Act applies—Section 4 of the principal Act is hereby amended by omitting from subsection (1) the words "coloured red or blue" (as substituted by section 2 of the Summit Road (Canterbury) Protection Amendment Act 1965), and substituting the words "coloured red, blue, or 5 yellow".

3. Crown bound—The principal Act is hereby further amended by repealing section 4A (as inserted by section 3 of the Summit Road (Canterbury) Protection Amendment Act 1965), and substituting the following section:

"4A. Crown bound-This Act shall bind the Crown."

4. Repeal—The Summit Road (Canterbury) Protection Amendment Act 1965 is hereby consequentially repealed.
