# WAIHOU DOMAIN BOARD EMPOWERING.

# [LOCAL BILL.]

## ANALYSIS.

Title. Preamble. 1. Short Title.

2. Power to grant use of domain.

#### A BILL INTITULED

An Act to enable the Waihou Domain Board to give a use of the Title. Waihou Domain for Annual-show Purposes.

WHEREAS the lands secondly described in the Schedule to the Preamble. 5 Te Aroha Recreation-ground and Racecourse Act, 1892, are a public domain controlled by the Waihou Domain Board, which Board has allowed the Thames Valley Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Association to erect a grand-stand and show-shed and make other improvements on the domain for the purposes of their annual show 10 or shows, and, when not in use therefor, for the use and occupation of the public as may be controlled by the Board:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same. as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Waihou Domain Board Short Title. 15 Empowering Act, 1925.

2. The Waihou Domain Board may grant to the Thames Power to grant use Valley Agricultural, Pastoral, and Horticultural Association for the of domain. purposes of their its annual show or shows, but not for more than three 20 days in each year, the exclusive use of the Waihou Domain, or any part thereof, with authority to demand a fee or charge for admission on such day or days to the said domain or part thereof so granted, not in any case exceeding for each day two shillings for each person, with an extra two shillings for every horse or vehicle which he takes 25 with him, unless such person desires to obtain admission to the

grand-stand, in which case an additional charge not exceeding five shillings may be imposed prior to his obtaining admission to such stand:

Provided that the total number of days in any year upon which the public shall not be entitled to admission to the domain unless on 5 payment of a charge is not to be hereby increased.
