A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend the Law relating to Workmen's Wages. Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Workmen's Wages Act 1893 Amendment Act, 1894." Short Title.
2. No condition or agreement whatsoever between a workman and his employer for the retention, forfeiture, or non-payment of any wages for any cause whatsoever is binding against such workman, save to the extent of one-fifth of the sum to which he would be entitled if no such condition or agreement existed. Agreement for forfeiture, &c., of wages, how far binding.
3. This Act is to be read with "The Workmen's Wages Act, 1893." Construction of Act.
