## APPROPRIATION BILL (NO. 2)

*Proposed Amendments*

Hon. Mr DOUGLAS, in Committee, to move the following amendments:

*Clause 7A:* To insert, after *clause 7*, the following clause:

**7A. Transitional provision in respect of Parliamentary Service**—Notwithstanding anything in section 2 of this Act or in section 53 of the Public Finance Act 1977, any part of the sum of \$14,280,000 appropriated by section 2 (2) of this Act for the services and purposes of the Vote Legislative may, pursuant to section 2 (1) of this Act, be issued and applied out of the Consolidated Account not only for the services and purposes of the Legislative Department but also for the services and purposes of the Parliamentary Service—

- (a) As if the Vote Legislative were the Vote Parliamentary Service; and
- (b) As if the services and purposes set out in the estimates for this year (B.7 [Pt.1]) as the services and purposes of the Legislative Department were services and purposes of the Parliamentary Service.

*Fourth Schedule:* To omit the following items:

"Vote—Crown Law	..	..	..	..	17
"Vote—Education	..	..	..	..	9
"Vote—Commission for the Environment	..	..	..	..	19,403"

and substitute the following items:

"Vote—Crown Law	..	..	..	..	9
"Vote—Education	..	..	..	..	19,403
"Vote—Commission for the Environment	..	..	..	..	17"

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

The amendments proposed in this Supplementary Order Paper are in substitution for those in Supplementary Order Paper No. 45.

The new *clause 7A* is a transitional provision that takes account of the establishment on 1 October 1985 of the Parliamentary Service.

The amendment to the Fourth Schedule corrects errors in that Schedule (which contains the unauthorised expenditure statement for the year 1984-85).

Three sums have been accidentally transposed and are not correctly aligned with the names of the 3 departments to which these sums relate. The amendment corrects the alignment of these 3 sums.
