REGULATION OF ELECTIONS BILL.

Mr. GEORGE, in Committee, to move the following amendment :—

In section 55, after the figures “55.”, to insert the following words :—

If any person, being chosen a member of the House of Representatives, shall accept of any office of profit from the Crown, during such time as he shall continue a member, his election shall be and is hereby declared to be void, and a new writ shall issue for a new election, as if such person so accepting was naturally dead: Provided nevertheless that such person shall be capable of being again elected, as if his place had not become void as aforesaid, or

COUNTIES ACT 1876 AMENDMENT BILL.

Hon. Mr. HALL, in Committee, to move the following new clause :—

Where any non-navigable river or stream runs lengthways between two or more counties wholly or in part, then the boundaries of each such county shall extend to the middle of such river or stream, following its natural course, and the boundaries of any county affected by this provision shall be deemed to be and are hereby altered accordingly.

Each of the counties divided by such river or stream shall bear all cost of cleansing the portion of such river or stream included within its boundaries, and of keeping in repair and maintaining the banks of such river or stream within such boundaries; but nothing herein contained shall control or interfere with any powers conferred upon the Governor or the Minister by “The Public Works Act, 1876,” or any Act amending the same.
