## HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Tuesday, the 15th day of August, 1882.

NATIVE RESERVES BILL.

Mr. Kelly, in Committee, to move the following amendments:-

Clause 2. Insert between the word "the" and "Board," in line 6, the words "Waste Lands Board in the district in which the reserve is situate."

Strike out the words "The Public Trust Office Act, 1872," in lines 6 and 7, and insert "The Land Act, 1877."

In section 8, line 46, after the word "regulations," insert the words "made under the authority of this Act."

In section 14, line 53, strike out the words "twenty-one years," and insert "forty-two years."

In the same section, subsection (b), strike out the words "best improvable rent obtainable," and insert "the fair market value."

New subsection,—

(b2). It shall be a condition of every lease that fair market value be given to the tenant at the end of his lease for improvements made on the reserve, such value to be ascertained by arbitration in the usual way.

LEASEHOLDERS' QUALIFICATION BILL.

Mr. W. White, in Committee, to move the following proviso to clause 2:—

Provided always that no elector shall, under the authority of this or any other Act, vote in respect of more than one electorate at any general or other election of Members of the House of Representatives.

NEW ZEALAND LOAN BILL.

Mr. Shrimski, in Committee, to move,—

When any railway or portion of a railway made under the provisions of this Act shall be opened for traffic, if the net returns from such railway or portion of a railway, after deducting working expenses, and all costs of repairs of permanent-way, rolling-stock, and plant be not sufficient to pay the interest upon the money expended in making such railway or portion of a railway, then the Governor in Council shall raise an amount sufficient to pay such interest by imposing and levying a tax in such manner and at such differential rates as the Governor in Council shall deem fit, upon all lands within fifteen miles from either side of such railway or portion of railway.

## FISHERIES BILL.

Hon. Mr. Dick, in Committee, to move—

Clause 2. After subsection 1, to insert the following:—

(2.) Any person taking eels at any time of the year; nor to Clause 5. Subsection 12, line 1, after "river" insert "bay." After subsection 12, insert

(13.) Prohibiting the use of nets of any kind for taking fish within any waters set apart for the natural or artificial propagation of fish.

taking fish on their migration to places for spawning.

Mr. Pyke to move the following new clause after clause 49:—

If any person shall take any fish or oysters on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday, he shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not more than *twenty* pounds.
