INDUSTRIAL CONCILIATION BILL.

Mr. WRIGHT, in Committee, to move the following amendment to clause 50 :—

50. The Court shall consist of five members to be appointed by the Governor, two to be so appointed on the recommendation of the councils or a majority of the councils of the associations of unions of employés of the colony, and two to be appointed by him on the recommendation of the councils or a majority of the councils of the associations of unions of employers thereof. No recommendation shall be made as to the fifth member, who shall be a Judge of the Supreme Court or of the District Court, at the discretion of the Government.

The procedure for the purpose of giving effect to this section shall, subject to section *thirty-six*, be as follows :—

WORKMEN'S LIEN BILL.

Mr. GUINNESS, in Committee, to move the following clause :—

In the event of a claim for moneys due to any workman not being paid within seven days after such moneys become due, it shall be lawful for such workman to claim, and for the Court to award him, compensation for the delay in the payment of such moneys.
