MORTGAGE DEBENTURES BILL.

Hon. Sir J. VOGEL, in Committee, to move the following amendments:—

In clause 2. Strike out paragraph commencing “Agent-General” and substitute the following:—

“English Agent” means any one of the persons, firms, or incorporated companies whom the Governor may from time to time appoint to carry out the purposes and provisions of this Act in Great Britain other than the Agent-General, who shall not be eligible for such appointment.

New clause 58A, under Part IV.,—

The Governor may from time to time appoint one or more English Agents to carry out the purposes and provisions of this Act in Great Britain, and he may also in like manner cancel such appointments.

To substitute the words “English Agent” for “Agent-General” in clauses 62, 66, 70, 71, 72, 74, 75, 77, and 79.

Clause 62. Strike out “prescribe” and substitute “be authorized by the Governor to charge.”

To add to clause 79. “There shall from time to time be paid by the company or others to the English Agent, in respect of all things done, or business transacted, or services rendered under this Act by such English Agent, such remuneration or fees as the Governor may from time to time prescribe.”

Form G, Schedule. To strike out all words after “Registrar” to “debentures” inclusive, and to insert in lieu “authorizing the issue of debentures deposited at my office with me, as English Agent appointed under the authority of the said Act.”

In the heading and in last line, Form G, to substitute the words “English Agent” for “Agent-General.”

In heading and last line, Form H, substitute “English Agent” for “Agent-General.”
