NATIVE LAND BILL.

Mr. Cadman, in Committee, to move the following new clause:—

All lands which, from the date of passing of this Act, may hereafter become alienated from Natives in any existing mining district, or in any district which may hereafter be proclaimed a mining district, shall be liable to be resumed for mining purposes by Her Majesty, on paying full compensation to the licensee, lessee, or owner of the fee-simple thereof, for value, other than auriferous or argentiferous, of the land and improvements so resumed, upon the terms and conditions provided in "The Mining Act, 1886," or any amendments thereof.

ELECTORAL BILL.

Sir J. Hall, on the Order of the Day for going into Committee, to move:—

That it be an instruction to the Committee to make provision for the extension of the electoral franchise to women.

LAND ACTS AMENDMENT BILL.

Hon. Mr. G. F. Richardson, in Committee, to move the following as a consequential amendment upon an amendment made in clause 13:—

Clause 12, omit all the italics after "previous to the," substitute "passing of this Act."

NEW ZEALAND STATE FORESTS ACT AMENDMENT BILL.

Hon. Mr. G. F. RICHARDSON, in Committee, to move the following amendments:— In subsection one of clause three to omit the words "rural

In subsection one of clause three to omit the words "rural lands," and substitute in lieu thereof "Crown lands, whether town, suburban, or rural land."

In subsection two of clause three to omit all words after "acquire"

and substitute the following:—

"Crown lands as aforesaid in any part of the colony to any value exceeding five hundred pounds in the whole." Clause 6 to be omitted.
