**THE ARMED FORCES DRIVERS' LICENCES EMERGENCY
REGULATIONS 1947**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington, this 18th day of
June, 1947

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Armed Forces Drivers' Licences Emergency Regulations 1947.

2. Every motor-driver's licence issued under Regulation 3 of the Motor-vehicles Emergency Regulations 1940* and in force on the revocation of those regulations by the Emergency Regulations Revocation Order No. 2† shall be deemed to have continued in force and shall continue in force until the end of the month of June, 1947, and shall then expire, unless it has been revoked by the Commissioner of Transport or is sooner revoked by him or is deemed to have been revoked as provided in these regulations.

3. (1) Where the holder of any such motor-driver's licence has ceased to serve in His Majesty's Forces (whether before or after the commencement of these regulations), the licence, unless sooner revoked by the Commissioner of Transport, shall be deemed to have been revoked on the day on which the holder so ceased to serve.

(2) Without limiting the effect of the foregoing provisions, it is hereby declared that a member of any of His Majesty's Naval, Military, or Air Forces shall be deemed, for the purposes of this regulation, to have ceased to serve in His Majesty's Forces on being retired, discharged, or dismissed from any such Force, or on being put on indefinite leave without pay, or in any other manner ceasing for an indefinite period to render full-time service in any such Force.

(3) The fact that the person to whom any such motor-driver's licence has been issued was at any time in civilian dress shall, in the absence of proof to the contrary, be sufficient evidence for the purposes of this regulation that he had before that time ceased to serve in His Majesty's Forces.
