ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 16th day of August 1982

PURSUANT to section 88 of the Defence Act 1971, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Army Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Army Regulations 1951* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Limit on jurisdiction of commanding officer to stop private's pay—Regulation 68 (a) of the principal regulations (as amended by section 7 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964) is hereby amended by omitting the expression "\$20", and substituting the expression "\$200".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations are made pursuant to the Defence Act 1971, and amend the Army Regulations 1951.

Regulation 67 of the principal regulations provides for the stopping of a private soldier's pay in certain specified circumstances. Regulation 68 (a) provides that a commanding officer may not stop more than \$20 without the approval of a superior military authority. These regulations raise that limit to \$200.
