

## THE ADMIRALTY RULES 1975, AMENDMENT NO. 1

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Admiralty Act 1973, the Judicature Act 1908, and the Shipping and Seamen Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and with the concurrence of the Right Honourable the Chief Justice and at least two of the other members of the Rules Committee constituted under the Judicature Amendment Act 1930 (as amended by section 2 of the Judicature Amendment Act (No. 2) 1968), of whom at least one was a Judge of the Supreme Court, hereby makes the following rules.

## RULES

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These rules may be cited as the Admiralty Rules 1975, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Admiralty Rules 1975\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules).
- (2) These rules shall come into force on the date of the commencement of the principal rules.
- 2. Collisions: Preliminary acts—Rule 24 (3) of the principal rules is hereby amended by omitting the words "a copy", and substituting the words "notice of the filing".
- 3. Form of warrant of arrest—Form 8 in the Schedule to the principal rules is hereby amended by omitting from the testatum the words "This Writ of Arrest", and substituting the words "This Warrant of Arrest".

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

Rule 2 amends rule 24 (3) of the principal rules, and requires notice of the filing by any party of a preliminary act filed in an action arising out of a collision between ships, and not a copy of the preliminary act itself, to be served on every other party who has filed a preliminary act.

Rule 3 corrects an error in form 8, Warrant of Arrest, in the Schedule to the

principal rules.
