ORDER IN COUNCIL

THE RIGHT HON. DAVID LANGE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 22 of the Territorial Sea and Exclusive Economic Zone Act 1977, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1983* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, and shall apply in respect of every licence granted under section 15 of the Act to have effect on and from the 1st

day of October 1984.

2. Increase in licence fees—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the First Schedule, and substituting the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

NEW FIRST SCHEDULE TO PRINCIPAL REGULATIONS

LICENCE FEES

- Licence to fish for squid by jigging
- 2. Licence to fish for squid by trawling
- 3. Licence to fish by trawling in Fisheries Management Area E
- 4. Licence to fish by trawling in areas other than Fisheries Management Area E
- Licence to fish by bottomlining
- Licence to fish for albacore and yellowfin tuna by longlining
- 7. Licence to fish for southern bluefin tuna by longlining
- 8. Licence as a fish carrier
- 9. Licence as a support craft

- \$25,350 a year to be paid before commencing fishing, plus \$169 per tonne of fish taken by the craft in excess of 150 tonnes.
- \$114 per tonne of fish that the craft is permitted by the conditions of its licence to take.
- \$40 per tonne of fish that the craft is permitted by the conditions of its licence to take.
- \$59 per tonne of fish that the craft is permitted by the conditions of its licence to take, together with a further \$11 per tonne of orange roughy (Hoplostethus atlanticus) caught.
- \$84 per tonne of fish that the craft is permitted by the conditions of its licence to take.
- \$7,500 per craft per year.
- \$74,000 per craft per year, payable on or before the 31st day of January 1985 for licences issued in respect of the fishing year commencing with the 1st day of October 1984.
- \$5 per tonne of the fish-carrying capacity of the craft for each voyage to the exclusive economic zone.
- \$2.50 per gross registered ton of the craft for each voyage to the exclusive economic zone."

1984/313 Exclusive Economic Zone (Licence Fees for Foreign Fishing Craft) Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 1

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide for an increase in the fees payable by foreign fishing craft for licences to fish in the exclusive economic zone for-

- (a) Jig caught squid, from \$20,250 to \$25,350 a year per vessel, plus an increase from \$135 per tonne to \$169 per tonne for the catch taken by each craft in excess of 150 tonnes:
- (b) Trawl caught squid, from \$103 to \$114 per tonne of fish allocated:
- (c) Trawl caught finfish in Fisheries Management Area E, from \$25 per tonne to \$40 per tonne of fish allocated, plus an extra \$11 a tonne for orange roughy:
- (d) Trawl caught finfish in areas other than Fisheries Management Area E, from \$47 per tonne to \$59 per tonne of fish allocated:
- (e) Bottom longline caught finfish, from \$67 per tonne to \$84 per tonne of fish allocated: (f) Longline caught albacore and yellowfin tuna, from \$4,500 per vessel to \$7,500 per vessel:
- (g) Longline caught southern bluefin tuna, from \$59,000 to \$74,000 per year:
- (h) Fish carrier, from \$3 to \$5 per tonne of the fish-carrying capacity of the craft: (i) Support craft, from \$1.50 to \$2.50 per gross registered ton of the craft.
- The licence fees for southern bluefin tuna are to be paid by 31 January 1985. No licences will be issued this year to fish for skipjack tuna by purse seining under the principal Act, so no references to this fishery have been made in these regulations.
