**THE FISHERIES (CHALLENGER AREA AMATEUR FISHING)
REGULATIONS 1986, AMENDMENT NO. 1**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Challenger Area Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Challenger Area Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Maximum daily scallop limit in Marlborough Sounds area—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 3, the following regulation:

“3A. Notwithstanding regulation 19 of the Fisheries (Amateur Fishing) Regulations 1986† or any other regulations made pursuant to the Fisheries

Act 1983 relating to maximum daily catches, any person may take on any one day up to 50 scallops (*Pecten novaezelandiae*) from all those waters enclosed by straight lines commencing at the easternmost point of Cape Campbell (at 41°43.8'S and 174°16.6'E); then to the easternmost point of The Brothers Islands (at 41°06.2'S and 174°26.5'E); then to the northernmost point of Stephens Island (at 40°39.9'S and 174°0.0'E); then to the Farewell Spit light (at 40°32.9'S and 173°0.6'E)."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The effect of these regulations is to increase the maximum daily catch allowed for scallops from 20 to 50 scallops per day within the Marlborough Sounds Area. The regulations come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
