



**THE FORESTRY ENCOURAGEMENT GRANTS REGULATIONS
1983, AMENDMENT NO. 2**

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Forests Act 1949, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Forestry Encouragement Grants Regulations 1983, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Forestry Encouragement Grants Regulations 1983* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Forestry encouragement grants—Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:

“(2) For the purposes of these regulations the expression ‘protection and production grant’ means a forestry encouragement grant payable in respect of qualifying expenditure incurred in relation to any forest or part of a forest where, before any preparation or development of the land on which the forest or part of the forest is to be planted is commenced,—

- “(a) An officer of a Catchment Board (within the meaning of the Soil Conservation and Rivers Control Act 1941) has certified that that land was, at the time of his certificate, in need of protection; and
- “(b) The Conservator has agreed that that land was then in need of protection.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Forestry Encouragement Grants Regulations 1983 to provide that a protection and production grant is only payable in respect of any forest where, before any preparation or development of any land for planting is commenced, the land is in need of protection.
