**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to section 89 of the Fisheries Act 1983, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

**1. Title and commencement**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 7th day of December 1991.

**2. Prohibition on taking or possession of salmon**—(1) Regulation 30A (3) of the principal regulations (as inserted by regulation 2 of the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986, Amendment No. 4) is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (d), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(d) The commercial fisherman surrenders ownership of the salmon to the Crown and disposes of them in accordance with the directions of a Fishery Officer.”

(2) Regulation 30A (5) of the principal regulations (as so inserted) is hereby amended by omitting the words “or disposed”, and substituting the words “and disposed”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 7 December 1991, amend regulation 30A of the Fisheries (Commercial Fishing) Regulations 1986 (which relates to salmon).

Regulation 30A (3) of the principal regulations formerly permitted a commercial fisherman to surrender to the Crown any salmon taken as bycatch or to dispose of the salmon according to the directions of a Fishery Officer. That provision is amended by these regulations to require bycatch salmon to be surrendered to the Crown in all cases before disposal.
