THE MONEY-ORDER AMENDING REGULATIONS 1939.

GALWAY, Governor-General.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government House at Wellington, this 30th day of
September, 1939.

Present :

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the power and authority vested in him by the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Money-order Amending Regulations 1939.

2. The regulations prescribing the commission on inland money-orders and the rates for sending money-orders by telegraph and referred to in the Schedule hereto are revoked.

3. The commission on money-orders issued in New Zealand payable in New Zealand or Cook Islands shall be 6d. for the first £6 and 1d. for each additional £1 or portion of £1.

4. The rates for sending by telegraph money-orders issued in New Zealand payable in New Zealand (not including Cook Islands) shall, in addition to the commission thereon, be according to the following table :—

Ordinary money-order telegrams	1s. 2d.
Urgent money-order telegrams	1s. 10d.
For a private communication to the payee added to the official telegram of advice (ordinary or urgent)	1d. per word.
