THE MARRIAGE REGULATIONS 1977

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 30th day of May 1977

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Marriage Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Marriage Regulations 1977.

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date

of their notification in the Gazette.

- 2. Interpretation—In these regulations "the Act" means the Marriage Act 1955; and a reference to a numbered form is hereby declared to be a reference to the form so numbered in the First Schedule to these regulations.
- **3. Forms**—(1) The forms set out in the First Schedule to these regulations shall be used in the proceedings under the Act to which those forms refer.
- (2) The Marriage Register Book to be kept pursuant to section 35 of the Act shall be in form 3.
- (3) Every certified copy of an entry of marriage in the Registrar-General's Office shall be in either form 10 or form 12.
- (4) Every certified copy of an entry of marriage in the register book in the lawful custody of a Registrar shall be in either form 11 or form 13.
- (5) Every certified copy of an entry of marriage shall include the particulars set out in the form used for that purpose so far as they are registered.

(6) Except where particulars of the parents of either of the parties to a marriage are material for the purpose for which the certified copy is required, a certified copy of an entry of marriage in form 10 or form 11, as the case may be, shall be issued and used in respect thereof:

Provided that where such particulars are so material a certified copy of an entry of marriage in form 12 or form 13, as the case may be, shall so

be issued and used.

4. Fees—(1) There shall be paid to the Registrar-General and to every Registrar, for the various matters set out in the Second Schedule to these regulations, the respective fees set out in that Schedule.

(2) There shall be paid to every New Zealand representative who gives a certificate under section 43 of the Act a fee of \$10 for each such

certificate.

5. Certificate under section 41 of Act—Where notice is received that a New Zealand citizen intends to be married in a country other than New Zealand and according to the law of that country, the Registrar-General shall, before the issue of the certificate referred to in section 41 of the Act, make the following searches and enquiries:

(a) He shall search the birth records to confirm the age of the

citizen:

- (b) He shall search the marriage records covering the period during which the citizen could have been married in New Zealand to ascertain if the citizen was so married:
- (c) He shall, if he considers it necessary in the circumstances to do so, inquire from some person who knows the citizen whether there is any impediment to the proposed marriage:

(d) He may in any case ask the Commissioner of Police to inquire and report as to whether or not there is any impediment to the

proposed marriage.

Section 31 of the Marriage Act 1955 provides:

(1) Every marriage solemnised by a marriage celebrant shall be solemnised at a place described in the marriage licence issued in respect of that marriage.

- (2) Subject to subsection (3) of this section, every such marriage shall take place between the persons named in the licence according to such form and ceremony as they may think fit to adopt, and shall be solemnised with open doors in the presence of a marriage celebrant and 2 or more witnesses at any time between 6 a.m. and 10 p.m.
- (3) During the solemnisation of every such marriage each party to it shall say to the other:
- I call on the people present here to witness that I, A. B., take you C. D., to be my legal wife (or husband), or words to similar effect.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations replace the Marriage Regulations 1956, and apart from deleting one form no longer in use reflect the lowering of the age of majority to 20, and the amendments effected by the Marriage Amendment Act 1976. The fees for various matters done pursuant to the Marriage Act 1955 have, with 3 exceptions, been increased.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 2 June 1977.

These regulations are administered in the Department of Justice.
