THE OVERTIME AND HOLIDAYS LABOUR LEGISLATION SUSPENSION ORDER 1941, AMENDMENT NO. 1

In pursuance of the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940,* I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941, Amendment No. 1.
- 2. This Order shall be read together with and deemed part of the Overtime and Holidays Labour Legislation Suspension Order 1941† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).
- 3. For the purpose of resolving doubts it is hereby declared as follows:—
 - (a) Nothing in the principal Order relating to time worked on holidays shall apply to time worked on the weekly holidays or half-holidays prescribed by the Shops and Offices Act, 1921-22, or any award or industrial agreement relating to workers whose conditions of employment are subject to that Act:
 - (b) Where the provisions of any award or agreement relating to rates of payment for overtime which have been suspended by the principal Order provided for the calculation of overtime payments on the basis of "full pay" as defined in the said award or agreement, payment for overtime under the provisions of the principal Order shall be calculated on "full pay" as so defined.

4. This Order shall come into force on the day of the date hereof. Dated at Wellington, this 2nd day of April, 1942.
