ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of December 1974

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Harbours Act 1950, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Otago Inland Harbours Regulations 1969, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Otago Inland Harbours Regulations 1969* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Passengers to wear life jackets—The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 9, the following regulation:

“9A. No person shall, after the 1st day of February 1975, navigate on any river or stream to which these regulations apply any vessel carrying any passengers for hire or reward, unless every such passenger is wearing a life jacket of a type complying with the requirements of Part 1 of the Tenth Schedule to the Shipping Lifesaving Appliances Rules 1968†.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations provide that no person may navigate on any river or stream to which the principal regulations apply any vessel carrying passengers for hire or reward, unless those passengers are wearing lifejackets of a type complying with the Shipping Lifesaving Appliances Rules 1968.

This requirement is to operate from 1 February 1975.
