# THE OLD PEOPLE'S HOMES REGULATIONS 1980, AMENDMENT NO. 1

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 7th day of December 1981

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 120A of the Health Act 1956 (as inserted by section 2 of the Health Amendment Act 1958 and amended by section 7 of the Health Amendment Act 1973 and section 6 of the Health Amendment Act 1979), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

## REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Old People's Homes Regulations 1980, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Old People's Homes Regulations 1980\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 14th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

**2. Kitchens**—Regulation 7 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:

"(3) Nothing in this regulation applies to a kitchen in any part of a home that constitutes a self-contained flat or cottage in which not more than 2 persons reside."

3. Staff—Regulation 35 of the principal regulations is hereby amended

by inserting, after subclause (2), the following subclause: "(2A) For the purposes of subclause (2) of this regulation, the number of residents in a home shall be computed exclusive of any person who is living in any part of the home that constitutes a self-contained flat or cottage in which not more than 2 persons reside."

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations exclude the application of the principal regulations relating to kitchens and staff numbers from self-contained flats and cottages.
