



**THE SLAUGHTER OF PIGS CONTROL ORDER 1943,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

IN pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939,* the Minister of Agriculture hereby makes the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Slaughter of Pigs Control Order 1943, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Slaughter of Pigs Control Order 1943† (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. This Order shall come into force on the seventh day after the date of the notification thereof in the *Gazette*.

3. The principal Order is hereby amended by adding the following clause thereto :—

“ 10. In any case where a chopper within the meaning of the Pig Marketing Emergency Regulations 1943‡ is slaughtered in any slaughterhouse an Inspector under the Meat Act, 1939, shall mark the carcass of the pig by making an incision with a knife through the skin on each side of the carcass, extending from the hock along the middle of the side to the neck.”
