PURSUANT to section 15 (1) of the Social Security Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title, commencement, and application—(1) This order may be cited as the Social Security (National Superannuation) Order 1981.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 10th day of February 1981.

(3) The first instalment of national superannuation in respect of which the rates prescribed by clause 2 of this order shall apply shall be the instalment due on the 10th day of February 1981.

2. Rates of national superannuation—The rates of national superannuation payable under Part I of the Social Security Act 1964 shall be—

(a) In the case of a married couple both of whom are entitled to receive national superannuation, \$135.46 a week:

(b) In the case of an unmarried person, \$81.28 a week:

(c) In the case of a married person whose spouse is not entitled to receive national superannuation—

(i) If the spouse of the applicant is, in his or her own right, in receipt of a benefit under Part I of the Social Security Act 1964 or of an economic pension, war veteran's allowance, or war service pension under the War Pensions Act 1954, \$67.73 a week:

(ii) In any other case, \$81.28 a week.

3. Revocation—The Social Security (National Superannuation) Order (No. 2) 1980* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 10 February 1981, fixes the rates of national superannuation.
