



## THE TAUPO FISHING REGULATIONS 1984, AMENDMENT NO. 9

### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 23rd day of May 1994

Present:

HER EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 14 of the Maori Land Amendment and Maori Land Claims Adjustment Act 1926, and to sections 48 and 48A of the Conservation Act 1987, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

**1. Title, commencement, and application**—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Taupo Fishing Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Taupo Fishing Regulations 1984\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1994.

(3) These regulations shall apply in respect of all licences issued in respect of any period commencing on or after the 1st day of July 1994.

**2. Restrictions on methods of fishing**—Regulation 16 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after subclause (3), the following subclause:

“(3A) Nothing in subclause (1) (j) of this regulation shall forbid the use of a downrigger, or a similar device, so long as—

“(a) The downrigger or other device does not contain or have attached to it’s weight more than 40 metres of suspension line; and

“(b) The fishing line used in conjunction with the downrigger or other device does not contain any wire, lead, or other metal; and

“(c) No device that increases the weight of that fishing line, or of any lure attached to that line, is attached to that line or that lure.”

**3. New Second Schedule substituted**—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Second Schedule (as substituted by regulation 3 (1) of the Taupo Fishing Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 7), and substituting the Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 3 of the Taupo Fishing Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 7 is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1994, amend the Taupo Fishing Regulations 1984.

*Regulation 2* amends regulation 16 of the principal regulations to permit the use of a downrigger or similar device that has up to 40 metres of suspension line and an unweighted fishing line. A downrigger is a suspended cable that has a weight used for sinking a line and lure to a specified depth. The use of any other downrigger to take trout in the District is prohibited.

*Regulation 3* substitutes a new Schedule of licence fees. The changes are as follows:

- (a) The fee payable in respect of an adult whole season licence is increased from \$46 to \$46.50;
- (b) The fee payable in respect of an adult monthly licence is increased from \$30 to \$30.50;
- (c) The fee payable in respect of an adult weekly licence is increased from \$22 to \$22.50;
- (d) The fee payable in respect of an adult day licence is increased from \$8 to \$9.
