
(21.) AUCKLAND CARPENTERS AND JOINERS.

Before the Board of Conciliation, in the Northern Industrial District.—In the matter of an industrial dispute between Malcolm and Ferguson and others, and the Auckland branch of the Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners' Industrial Union, and of a reference thereof for settlement.

The Board, having heard evidence in the above case, recommend as follows:—

That, whereas under an award of the Court of Arbitration, dated the 18th July, 1899, an industrial agreement was prepared and signed by the master builders of Auckland and the Auckland branch of the Amalgamated Society of Carpenters and Joiners' Industrial Union, and whereas C. Reid, D. L. Cochran, and W. H. Edwards having failed to sign the said agreement, the Board recommend that the said C. Reed, D. L. Cochran, and W. H. Edwards be required to sign the said agreement on or before the 22nd November at noon; and, failing to do so, the case is referred to the Court of Arbitration for settlement.
