(4262.) AUCKLAND, GISBORNE, NEW PLYMOUTH, NAPIER, WEL-LINGTON, PICTON, WESTPORT, TIMARU, OAMARU, PORT CHALMERS, AND BLUFF WATERSIDE WORKERS.—AGREEMENT.

This industrial agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1908, this 16th day of March, 1916, between the New Zealand Waterside Workers' Federation Industrial Association of Workers, on its own behalf and also on behalf of its component unions — viz., Wellington Wharf Labourers' Industrial Union of Workers, Auckland Waterside Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, New Plymouth Watersiders' Industrial Union of Workers, Gisborne Waterside Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, Napier Wharf Labourers' and Stevedores' Industrial Union of Workers, Timaru Wharf Labourers' Industrial Union of Workers, Port Chalmers Waterside Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, Bluff Waterside Industrial Union of Workers, Picton Wharf Labourers' Industrial Union of Workers, and Westport Waterside Workers' Industrial Union of Workers, (hereinafter called the "union") of the one part, and

Wellington, Havelock, and Motueka Shipping Company (Limited),

Wellington and Wanganui Steam Packet Company (Limited),

(hereinafter called "the employers") of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows, that is to say,—

- 1. That the terms, conditions, stipulations, and provisions contained and set out in the schedule hereto shall be binding upon the said parties, and they shall be deemed to be and are hereby incorporated in and declared to form part of this agreement.
- 2. The said parties hereto shall respectively do, observe, and perform every matter and thing by this agreement and by the said terms, conditions, stipulations, and provisions respectively required to be done, observed, and performed, and shall not do anything in contravention of this agreement or of the said terms, conditions, stipulations, and provisions, but shall in all respects abide by and perform the same.

## Travelling to and from Roadstead.

Men engaged to work on boats lying in Napier Roadstead shall be paid from the time of leaving the wharf, and shall receive pay for a quarter of an hour after leaving ship's side, but should more than half an hour be taken in coming ashore the men shall be paid for such additional time occupied.

16. Clause 7 of the said Napier agreement shall be varied by providing that—

Holidays.

All work on Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday shall be paid at double ordinary overtime rates. All work on other holidays, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., shall be at ordinary overtime rates (at the rate fixed to 10 p.m.), and before 8 a.m. and after 5 p.m. at double ordinary time.

17. In lieu of clause 8 of the said Napier agreement the following clause shall be substituted:—

## Meal-hours.

The meal-hours to be as follows: Breakfast, 7 a.m. to 8 a.m.; dinner, 12 noon to 1 p.m.; tea, 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. Men required to work after midnight shall receive one hour or half-hour (at option of worker) for supper between 10 p.m. and midnight. Men employed from midnight to 7 a.m. shall receive half an hour for refreshments, and for this half-hour they shall be paid.

Men shall work during meal-hours if required to do so, and shall be paid at double ordinary rates for dinner, tea, and refreshment hours worked, and also for breakfast-hour if worked when men have been working from midnight, otherwise the breakfast-hour shall be paid for at ordinary overtime rate.

Ordinarily men shall take their meal-hours at times specified above, but when working frozen meat or frozen cargo, if required, may work a quarter of an hour past 7 a.m., 12 noon, or 5 p.m., the time of starting the meal, to finish discharge of truck or lighter, and then shall be granted a full hour; the pay for such quarter of an hour shall be at the rate per hour of the time immediately preceding. This subclause only applies to frozen cargo.

Should the men be called upon to work beyond the quarter of an hour, they shall be paid for half an hour at meal-time rate and then receive one full hour or half an hour, at option of worker, for meal, for which they shall not be

paid.

Men shall not be called upon at any time to work for more than five hours without a meal except when finishing the loading or discharge of a ship, when they may work for six hours.

18. Clause 11 of the said Napier agreement shall be varied by adding a proviso that five men shall be engaged shovelling in the hold in the case of screened New Zealand coal, except in the case of steamers of 250 tons net register and under.

19. Clause 19 of the said Napier agreement shall be deleted.

Fractional Time.

Fractions of an hour shall be paid for as follows: If a man shall work not more than five minutes in a quarter of an hour he shall not be paid for the same, but if he shall work more than five minutes in such quarter of an hour he shall be paid for a quarter of an hour.

- 36. Clause 15 of the said Picton award shall be varied by adding a proviso that five men shall be engaged shovelling in the hold in the case of screened New Zealand coal, except in the case of steamers of 250 tons net register and under.
  - 37. Clauses 17 and 21 of the said Picton award shall be deleted.
- 38. It is agreed that the following additional clauses shall be inserted in each and every agreement or award referred to in clause 1 of the schedule hereto:—
- (a.) (1.) It is agreed that the work of the employers at all ports shall in future be carried on in the same manner as prior to 26th August, 1915, and that no restriction will be imposed whereby overtime shall cease at 10 p.m.; and the union undertakes that no restrictions relating to overtime work shall be permitted to be made during the currency of this agreement, and further undertakes that the executive of the union and the executive of the New Zealand Waterside Workers' Federation will at all times do all that is reasonably possible to secure that any member thereof without work will accept any work offered to him which is of the kind usually taken by such worker, and that every member thereof shall carry out his obligations to the employer.

(2.) Men commencing work at 8 a.m. shall not (unless they choose) be obliged to work for more than fourteen hours continuously, inclusive of meal-hours, except in the case of ships finishing, when they shall, if required, work on until midnight. Men commencing work after 8 a.m. but before 2 p.m. shall not (unless they choose) be obliged to work later than midnight:

Provided that in either case men desiring to cease work at the expiration of the fourteen hours or at midnight (as the case may be) shall notify the foreman not later than one hour prior to the time fixed for the last engagement of labour for the day.

(3.) If men are employed all night they shall not (unless they choose) be

called upon to continue work after 8 a.m. the following morning.

(4.) If a ship is intended to work all night and men are engaged to commence work at 10 p.m. or later, such men shall be paid a minimum of six hours' pay, even if the job does not occupy that time.

(5.) If men are ordered down for midnight start, and the ship does not arrive and the men are discharged, they shall receive a minimum of four hours' pay.

(6.) If special overtime (i.e., overtime between 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.) is required, the employer shall, as early as possible, notify the union of the fact, and the union shall similarly notify the men by posting a notice at the place of engagement, stating the boats requiring to work such special overtime.

Clause (a) shall not apply to bar harbours (at which ports work shall be

carried on as required by the employer), and shall not apply-

(1.) In the case of vessels loading or discharging in a roadstead.
(2.) Cargo being landed on a wharf from a vessel in a roadstead.

(3.) To cargo being loaded at a wharf for a vessel in a roadstead.

(4.) To vessels of 250 tons net register and under at Napier and Gisborne.
(b.) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in any of the industrial agreements or awards referred to in clause 1 of the schedule hereto, if men are called upon to commence work at 7 a.m. on Monday mornings they shall be paid at double ordinary rates for the breakfast-hour from 7 a.m. to

8 a.m.

(c.) In each and every agreement or award referred to in clause 1 of the schedule hereto the following preference clause shall, as from the respective dates of expiry originally fixed by such agreements or awards, be substituted for the preference clauses now respectively contained in the said agreements

or awards:-

"If and so long as the rules of the union shall permit any person of good character and sober habits to become a member of such union on payment of an entrance fee not exceeding 5s. upon his written or verbal application to the secretary, without ballot or other election, and so to continue upon payment of subsequent contributions not exceeding 1s. per week, then and in such case and thereafter the employers shall employ members of the union in preference to non-members, provided that there are members of the union available equally qualified with non-members to perform the particular work required to be done, and ready and willing to undertake it: Provided that a man shall become eligible for employment as if already a member of the union if he shall bona fide give notice in writing to the secretary of the union of his desire to join the union, and shall pay or deposit with such notice a sum not exceeding 5s.

"Employers in employing labour shall not discriminate against members of the union, and shall not, in the engagement or dismissal of men or in the conduct of their business, do anything for the purpose of injuring the union directly or

indirectly.

"When members of the union and non-members are employed together there shall be no distinction between members and non-members, and both shal

work together in harmony and shall receive equal pay for equal work."

(d.) The essence of this agreement being that the work of the employers shall always proceed in the customary manner, and shall not on any account whatsoever be impeded, it is agreed that if any dispute or difference shall arise between the parties bound by this agreement or any of them, whether as to its construction or meaning, or as to any other matter whatever arising out of or connected therewith, every such dispute or difference as the same shall arise shall be referred to a committee—to be composed of three representatives of the union at the port concerned, and three representatives of the employers—for their decision. The decision of the majority of the committee shall be

binding, and if no decision is arrived at the committee shall submit the point in dispute to some independent person to be chosen by it, and if his decision is not acceptable to both parties, then the matter shall be referred to the New Zealand Waterside Workers' Federation and the employer or employers concerned, and if they are unable to arrive at a decision either party may appeal to the Court of Arbitration upon giving written notice of such appeal to the other party within fourteen days after the matter in dispute has been so referred to the New Zealand Waterside Workers' Federation and the employer or employers concerned.

The above-mentioned local committees shall also deal with the various

matters specifically referred to them by this agreement.

The following matters are referred to local committees to be dealt with:—
To the Wellington Committee: The matter of travelling for slip
workers employed at the workshops, Evans Bay.

To the Auckland Committee: The conditions to govern working with trollies.

To the Bluff Committee: The payment to be made for working mealhours, and the payment of overtime on Sundays and holidays.

To the Gisborne Committee: The payment to be made for working meal-hours, and the payment of overtime on Sundays and holidays.

(e.) The temperature at which coal shall be considered "hot" shall be fixed by agreement at as early a date as practicable (i.e., on arrival of the first cargo of hot coal after the date hereof).

(f.) The rates fixed by this agreement are standard rates for the various

classes of work specified.

(g.) Chain slings shall be used when discharging and loading lime and cement in bags.

39. This agreement shall come into force from the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force until the 31st day of December, 1916.
