GISBORNE, TARANAKI, WELLINGTON, MARLBOROUGH, NELSON, WEST-LAND, CANTERBURY, AND OTAGO AND SOUTHLAND NURSERYMEN AND GARDENERS—ORDER EXTENDING SCOPE TO NORTHERN INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT AND ADDING PARTIES TO AWARD

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand, Northern Industrial District—In the matter of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954: And in the matter of the Gisborne, Taranaki, Wellington, Marlborough, Nelson, Westland, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Nurserymen and Gardeners' Award, dated the 11th day of December 1959, and recorded in 59 Book of Awards 1693.

Upon reading the application to extend the Gisborne, Taranaki, Wellington, Marlborough, Nelson, Westland, Canterbury, and Otago and Southland Nurserymen and Gardeners' Award, dated the 11th day of December 1959, so as to add parties in another industrial district, which application was made by the New Zealand Nurserymen and Landscape Gardeners Industrial Association of Employers and the New Zealand Federated Labourers and Related Trades Industrial Association of Workers parties to the said award and was filed herein on the 5th day of February 1960: And upon being satisfied that notice of the said application has been given to the unions hereinafter named and that the said unions have concurred therein: And upon being satisfied that conditions of employment or of trade are such as to make it equitable to do so, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 158 of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act 1954, doth hereby make orders as follow:

1. That the undermentioned unions be and they are hereby added as parties to the said award:

Auckland Ceramic, Concrete, Builders' and General Labourers and Related Trades Industrial Union of Workers, 196 Hobson Street, Auckland.

Auckland Nurserymen and Landscape Gardeners' Industrial Union of Employers, National Insurance Building, O'Connell Street, Auckland.

2. That the locality to which the said award relates be and it is hereby extended so as to include the whole of the Northern Industrial District.
