**NEW ZEALAND PAINTING AND DECORATING INDUSTRY—AMENDMENT OF  
APPRENTICESHIP ORDER**

In the Court of Arbitration of New Zealand—In the matter of the Apprentices Act 1948: And in the matter of the New Zealand Painting and Decorating Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 8th day of March 1961, and recorded in 61 Book of Awards 179.

WHEREAS by section 13 (2) of the Apprentices Act 1948, the Court is empowered to amend any apprenticeship order: And whereas application has been made to the Court by the New Zealand Painting and Decorating Apprenticeship Committee

for amendment of the New Zealand Painting and Decorating Industry Apprenticeship Order, dated the 8th day of March 1961, and recorded in 61 Book of Awards 179: And whereas the Court has considered the recommendations made to it by the said Committee: Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in it by the said Act, doth hereby order as follows:

1. That the said apprenticeship order shall be amended in the manner following:

(1) By deleting paragraph (i) of subclause (b) of clause 11 (Wages) and substituting the following paragraph:

“(i) Every apprentice who has passed the First Qualifying Examination of the New Zealand Trades Certification Board shall be paid an additional 7s. 6d. a week from the date he produces to his employer a notification of his passing the examination; and if he produces to his employer a notification of a pass in Paper A of the Second Qualifying Examination of that Board he shall be paid a further additional 5s. a week; and if he produces to his employer a notification of a pass in Paper B of the Second Qualifying Examination of that Board he shall be paid a further additional 5s. a week.”

(2) By deleting the words “full set of pencils” from the list of signwriters’ tools in the Schedule to the order as inserted by the amending order dated the 23rd day of August 1963.

2. That this order shall operate and take effect as from the day of the date hereof.
