Customs' Duties.

No. XXIV.

An Act to alter and amend the Duties of Customs Customs' Duties. payable in the Colony of New South Wales and on Spirits distilled therein. [Reserved— 22nd December, 1843.]

THEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and sixth Preamble. VV years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Act 5 and 6 Victoria for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land" chap. 76. it was enacted that the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof should have power to make laws for the peace welfare and good government of the said Colony and it was further provided by the said Act that all Bills altering or affecting the Duties of Customs upon any goods wares or merchandise imported to or exported from the said Colony should be reserved for Her Majesty's pleasure except such Bills for temporary laws as the Governor might expressly declare necessary to be forthwith assented to by reason of some pressing emergency and whereas it will be for the advantage of the trade and commerce of the said Colony that a fixed duty should in some cases be substituted for an aid valorem duty and that the duties on spirits imported into or distilled in the Colony should be lowered Be it therefore enacted by His Fixed duties substi-Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and duties on articles consent of the Legislative Council thereof That from and after the enumerated in Schedule A. approval of this Act by Her Majesty and the notification of such approval in the Colony there shall be levied on all articles imported into the Colony of New South Wales enumerated in the Schedule to this Act annexed marked A the duty specified against such article in the said Schedule in lieu of the ad valorem duty at present payable on the same Provided always that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council by proclamation to exempt flour wheat or other grain from the duties in the said Schedule specified for such period as the said Governor with such advice as aforesaid may from time to time direct and appoint.

2. And be it enacted That the duties payable on the importation Duties on spirituous into this Colony of spirituous liquors of any description shall be reduced liquors imported into this Colony to to one-half of the amount now payable by law on such spirits Pro-be reduced to onevided that spirits imported into this Colony from any British possession half of their present amount. being the produce and manufacture thereof shall be chargeable with no other or greater duty than spirits the produce and manufacture of the United Kingdom imported into the said Colony directly from the said United Kingdom.

3. And be it enacted That the duty on spirits distilled in the Duties on spirits Colony shall in like manner be reduced to one-half of the amount now distilled in this payable by law on such spirits.
