An Act to authorize the granting to the Council of Education of portion of certain Park Lands of the Corporate Town of Port Augusta.

[Assented to, 21st December, 1877.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to authorize the granting to the Council of Education of portion of certain Park Lands—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

Preamble.

1. The Governor, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, may grant in fee simple to the Council of Education, as sites for school buildings, any convenient portion of the Corporate Town of Port Augusta, called or known as Park Lands, not exceeding in the whole five acres: Provided that no grant of any such lands shall be made unless on the written request of the Corporation of the said town, such request being testified by writing, sealed with the common seal of such Corporation, and signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Town Clerk thereof.

Park Lands may be granted to Council.

2. From and after the making of any such grant the land granted shall cease to be reserved or dedicated as a place for public recreation and amusement.

Land granted shall cease to be reserved.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
